

CONTRACTORS – Can you Afford NOT to get Certified?



The new EPA “Renovate, Repair and Paint” rule requires ALL professionals working in pre-1978 homes, schools, and day care centers who disrupt more than six square feet of lead paint to become EPA Certified in lead-safe practices.

Contractors are required to take a one-day training course and firms must apply to the EPA. Certification is good for five years. If not compliant, **YOU** could face **tens of thousands of dollars in fines** in the future. In addition to contractors, this rule applies to ***renovators, builders, maintenance people, landlords, custodians and others.***

STL Lead Prevention Coalition, Healthy Homes-Healthy Families is offering EPA certified RRP trainings through a partnership with St. Louis University’s Center for Environmental Education & Training for individuals, companies and groups at \$150 per person. Classes are held monthly.
